SUMMARY

Accept a total of \$22,268 in cash donations from various businesses, organizations and individuals and acknowledge in-kind donations for Regional Parks and Open Space programs and facilities.

Washoe County Strategic Objective supported by this item: Sustainability of our financial, social and natural resources.

PREVIOUS ACTION

On February 10, 2015, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) accepted cash donations [\$142,197.08] from the Wilbur May Foundation restricted for Wilbur D. May Center facility improvement projects, and underwriting specific operating costs for staff, travel, training and marketing.

On January 13, 2015, the Board accepted cash donations [\$35,668.95] from various businesses, organizations and individuals and acknowledge in-kind donations for Regional Parks and Open Space programs and facilities; and direct the Comptroller's Office to make the appropriate budget adjustments.

Donations are frequently made to the Regional Parks and Open Space programs and facilities and formally accepted by the Board.
