- WHEREAS, To successfully address the surging population of older adults and others with significant needs for long-term services and supports, we must develop methods to encourage and support Nevada's family caregivers, while developing ways to recruit and retain a qualified, responsive in-home care workforce; and
- WHEREAS, Washoe County and partners across the state promote the CARE Act as a means to support family caregivers and keep loved ones living at home;
