Who We Are Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority

- Owners/Operators
 - Reno-Tahoe International Airport
 - Reno-Stead Airport
- * 8 passenger airlines serve RNO
- * 3 cargo airlines
- 3 runways, 23 gates
- 24/7 operation
- Nine member Board appointed by Reno, Sparks, Washoe County and the RSCVA





Who We Are Reno-Tahoe Airport Authority

- Financially self-sufficient
 - Operate on fees/rent collected from airport tenants
 - 65% of operating revenues are generated by non-airline sources
- No local tax dollars to operate airport



A City Unto Itself...

Operationally independent with police and fire departments, human resources, accounting, etc.



Economic engine

- ❖ 66th busiest commercial airport in U.S.
- Airport's economic impact analyzed by UNR College of Business
 - \$2 billion per year for Washoe County
 - 737 brings nearly \$100,000 per landing
 - 2,500 jobs at Reno-Tahoe International










- Cargo at Reno-Tahoe International Airport
 - RNO handled 156 million pounds of air cargo, an increase of 13% when compared to the year 2015
 - Best year recorded in the history of RNO for air cargo lift

Master Plan for Reno-Tahoe International Airport

- Began October 2016
- 16-month master planning process to address airport growth, aviation industry changes, and FAA standards for next 20 years.
- Provides funding roadmap and addresses the dynamics of air service and cargo while balancing the needs of the community
- Outreach to all parts of the catchment area and all constituents

Local Advertising Campaign

- Air Service Education Program
- Educate RNO catchment area on flights and airlines available at Reno-Tahoe International
- Capture passenger data for future marketing
- Enter to win giveaway to non-stop destinations
- 30,000 entries so far

Atlantic Aviation

- Largest Fixed Base Operator (FBO) in the U.S.
- \$15M investment in FBO, apron improvements and fuel storage facility
 - Two-story 13,000 sq ft terminal and 29,800 sq ft attached hangar
 - Includes new pilots lounge, passenger facilities, conference rooms, coffee bar
 - 85% Occupancy

Reno-Stead Airport Airfield Features

Over \$50 million has been invested in airport improvements over the last 12 years





- New Stead Terminal Building
- Airfield designed to commercial aircraft standards
- Instrument Landing System and GPS approaches
- UAS Test Range
- Maintenance and Repair Operators – UAS and aircraft MRO services and avionics available on-site
- Upcoming \$22M investment in Runway 8/26 rehabilitation

- Changes to the airport's front door
 - Development agreement next to the Hyatt
 Place Hotel (corner of Terminal & Plumb)
 - Includes new hotel and land for office space and food and beverage offerings





Coming Soon...Common Use Lounge


- Exciting new common use business lounge

Rideshare Driving a New Market

- Transportation Network Companies (TNCs) includes Uber & Lyft
- Account for 52% of all TNC/Taxi customer transport
 - April 2017 TNC trip activity = 6,590 trips, compared to 2,147 in April 2016; an increase of 4,443
 - April 2017 taxi trip activity = 6,050 trips, compared to 6,490 in April 2016; a decrease of 440 trips
