Nevada Interdiction Task Force funding [amount not to exceed

\$8,250.23, no County match required] for the retroactive grant period of 01/01/2015-12/31/2016, all to be used for overtime, investigative, and travel expenses from High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas (HIDTA) as administered through Las Vegas Metro Police Department, and direct Comptroller's Office to make the necessary budget amendments. SUMMARY

This funding is received from the United States Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) and awarded to the Las Vegas Metro Police Department and made available to agencies across the State. These funds will be used to cover overtime, investigative, and travel expenses for participation of the Washoe County Sheriff's Office in the Northern Nevada Drug Task Force as part of the Nevada High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA) Task Force. The mission of the HIDTA program is to disrupt the market for illegal drugs in the United States by assisting federal, state and local law enforcement entities participating in the HIDTA program to dismantle and disrupt drug trafficking organizations.

The award for the state of Nevada as a whole is \$1,752,380 for HIDTA 2017. Of that, an amount not to exceed \$75,000.00 is available for use by the Northern Nevada Interdiction Task Force (WCSO's estimated portion not to exceed \$40,000). The award for the state of Nevada as a whole is \$3,269,579 for HIDTA 2016. Of that, an amount not to exceed \$93,000.00 is available for use by the Northern Nevada Interdiction Task Force (WCSO's estimated portion not to exceed \$50,000). The award for the state of Nevada as a whole

is \$602,820 for HIDTA 2015, of which WCSO's portion is \$8,250.23. This is not awarded as a sub-grant. The funding is made available to Nevada for task force operations. North Las Vegas Metro Police Department is the designated fiscal agent and prepares the reimbursement claims for task force operations.

BACKGROUND

The mission of the HIDTA program is to disrupt the market for illegal drugs in the United States by assisting federal, state and local law enforcement entities participating in the HIDTA program in the dismantling and disruption of drug trafficking organizations. Washoe County became part of Northern Nevada HIDTA Task Force in the fall of 2006, when the Board formally approved the Washoe County Sheriff's participation by way of interlocal agreement on November 13, 2006.

Las Vegas Metro Police Department acts as the fiscal agent and administers the State of Nevada HIDTA grant award. This \$98,250.23 will fund overtime and investigative expenses incurred while conducting highway, bus and train drug interdiction and travel expenses for HIDTA related training and/or meetings.

Reason for retroactive submittal: Item is being submitted to the first available BCC meeting upon completing past HIDTA funding streams.

- 2. This award is subject to the requirements in ONDCP's HIDTA Program Policy and Budget Guidance.
- 3. No HIDTA funds shall be used to supplant state or local funds that would otherwise be made available for the same purposes.

- 4. The requirements of 28 CFR Part 23, which pertain to information collection and management of criminal intelligence systems, shall apply to any such systems supported by this award.
- 5. Special accounting and control procedures must govern the use and handling of HIDTA Program funds for confidential expenditures; i.e. the purchase of information, evidence, and services for undercover operations. Those procedures are described in Section 6-12 of the HIDTA Program Policy and Budget Guidance.
