




Substance Involved Fatalities 2016-2021

- Help develop a resilience program that will:
 - Assess the vulnerability of the Department's transportation systems to determine the impacts of climate-related extreme weather and other stressors.
 - Identify projects and develop strategies to address the vulnerabilities identified through the assessment and promote resilience throughout system.
 - Incorporate resiliency into long-term transportation planning, design consideration, and operations.
 - Prevent/mitigate/adapt to natural hazards resulting from climate changes and other transportation system disturbances.





The <u>STIP</u> includes Federal projects and MPO TIP projects.
The <u>Short-Range Element, also known as the 4 Year Work</u>
<u>Program, lists STIP projects, and projects that the state and local entities would like to initiate in years 2-4.</u>

The <u>Annual Work Program</u> lists the current fiscal years STIP projects, the betterments, and rehabilitation projects completed by state forces and district contracts.


Federal Funds Direct to MPO's


- Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) receive direct sub-allocations of Federal Funds as dictated by the Federal Statutes for several programs
- MPO's also receive CMAQ Funds allocated by NDOT






Factors Influencing Geographic Splits














Planned Obligations in Work Program



Projects with Preservation as Primary Project Type \$1,389 M




Projects with Primary Project Type NOT Preservation \$2,057 M






Justice 40 Requirements

- USDOT has defined Disadvantaged Communities (DAC's) and set a target that 40% of the benefit of the federal funding go to these communities
- Evaluated location of projects in DAC's
 - 1/3 of projects are in DAC's
 - · 54% of the investment is located in DAC's
- Continuing to refine process to evaluate impact on DAC's








State Vs. Local Road Crashes and Safety Plans






Grant Funding for U.S. 395/North Virginia Street


